

PRL: Recordkeeping Requirements for Pesticide Applicators

Commercial Applicators, Commercial Technicians, Anti-Fouling Paint Applicators, and Private Applicators

NYS Recordkeeping Requirements

New York State's Pesticide Reporting Law (PRL) (Environmental Conservation Law Article 33 Title 12 Section 1205) and the corresponding regulations (Title 6 NYCRR Part 325.25), requires every certified commercial applicator, certified private applicator, and certified commercial technician, to maintain daily use records for all pesticide activities and to maintain those records for a minimum of 3 years.



Commercial Applicators



Certified Commercial Applicators, Certified Technicians, and Anti-Fouling Paint Applicators

- Must record the following information for every pesticide application:
 - EPA Registration Number*
 - Product name*
 - Quantity of each pesticide used* (undiluted amount)
 - Date applied*
 - Location of application by address, municipality, and zip code*
 - Dosage rates (e.g., 2 oz/gal)
 - Methods of Application (e.g., backpack sprayer, granular spreader)
 - Target organisms (plant, insect, disease, etc., that you want to kill/repel/reduce)
 - Specific place of application (e.g., baseboards, trees, soil, perimeter of structure)

^{*}Records that must be reported annually

Address of Application vs. Place of Application

Address of Application: The general location of the application. Must include street number, street name, county, municipality, and zip code. In areas that have no street number and street name, the following may be used:

- cross-roads
- mile markers
- utility pole numbers
- or another agreed-upon location identifier (not including GPS coordinates). Please check with your regional DEC office if a location identifier is acceptable for use.

Place of Application: The <u>detailed</u> description of where the product was applied. Can include:

- The target surface (e.g., lawn, fence, baseboards, pine trees)
- A detailed map of the application site(s)
- GPS coordinates



Quantity Used vs. Dosage Rate

Quantity Used: The <u>undiluted</u> amount of <u>product used</u> in the application.

• Example: If you diluted 0.5 fluid ounces per gallon of a pesticide product and applied 1,000 gallons, you need to record that 500 fluid ounces of the product was applied, <u>not</u> 1,000 gallons of the mixture.


Dosage Rate: The mixing or application rate <u>listed on the label</u> (can be a fraction of two units or a percent solution).

- Example: If the label lists 0.5 fl oz/gal as the mixing rate and you applied 500 fl oz/1,000 gallons, record the dosage rate as 0.5 fl oz/gal.
- If the pesticide is a ready-to-use (RTU) product, enter the rate as indicated in the label directions. If there is no rate indicated in the label directions, enter RTU.



Don't Forget to Record These!

- "Weed and Feed" fertilizer products should have an EPA Reg. No. and must be included in daily use records.
- Minimum Risk products must be included in daily use records, even though they are not included in annual reports.
 - Minimum Risk products will not have an EPA Reg. No., but they can generally be identified by their active ingredients (e.g., citronella, peppermint oil, lauryl sulfate). A full list of Minimum Risk active ingredients can be found on <u>EPA's Minimum Risk webpage</u>.

Applicators Responsibility

- Certified Applicators and Certified Technicians are individually responsible for recording the applications they make.
- Applications made by apprentices must be included in the daily use records of the supervising Certified Applicator (not a Technician).



Form 26 aka (44-15-26)

- DEC's Form 26 can be used to fulfill recordkeeping (and reporting) requirements for applicators.
- Form 26 is available for download in both paper format and electronic format.



Annual Reports

Commercial Applicators and Technicians are required to report their pesticide applications to DEC every year by February 1st (even if they made no applications!).

Private Applicators



Certified Private Applicators

- Must maintain records of the following information:
 - Restricted pesticides purchased
 - Crops treated with restricted pesticides
 - Methods of application
 - Dates of application
- Records must be maintained for 3 years and shall be available for inspection upon request by the Department.
- The "Pesticide Application Recordkeeping Form for Private Applicators" can be used as a template to fulfill recordkeeping requirements for NYS and is available online on DEC's Pesticide Webpage under "Forms Related to Pesticides".

WPS Records

- Certified private applicators, pesticide handlers, and others applying pesticides on an agricultural establishment must also maintain records required by the Worker Protection Standard (WPS).
- The "Pesticide Application Recordkeeping Form for Private Applicators" can also be used to fulfill most WPS recordkeeping requirements.
- WPS <u>also</u> requires employers to maintain records of the Safety Data Sheets of the pesticides applied.
- All WPS records must be retained for 2 years and must be available for inspection upon request.
