## **NYS Pesticide Reporting Requirements**

New York State's Pesticide Reporting Law (Article 33 Title 1205 Paragraph 1 of NYS's Environmental Conservation Law) requires all Certified Commercial Applicators to annually report their pesticide applications made in the calendar year (January 1 – December 31) to the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) no later than February 1st.

- Commercial Applicators who must report annually include:
  - Certified Commercial Applicators (ID # CXXXXXXX)
  - Certified Commercial Technicians (ID # TXXXXXX)
  - Certified Aquatic Antifouling Paint Applicators (ID # BXXXXXX)
- Any individuals who were certified at any point during the reporting year must report their pesticide activities, even if they did not make any pesticide applications that year.

## Those Who Do NOT Report Annually

#### **Private Applicators**

- Do NOT submit annual reports to the Department,
- BUT they must still maintain records required by ECL 1205(2)(b), 6 NYCRR 325.25(d), and records required by the federal Worker Protection Standard (WPS).

#### **Pesticide Apprentices**

- Do NOT submit annual reports to the Department,
- BUT their applications must be reported by their supervising Certified Commercial Applicator.



#### Commercial Applicators, Technicians, and Anti-Fouling Paint Applicators

- Must report for <u>each</u> commercial pesticide application they make:
  - EPA Registration Number
  - Product name
  - Quantity of each pesticide used (undiluted)
  - Date applied
  - Location of application by address (including 5-digit zip code).
- Although minimum-risk pesticides must be recorded in daily use records, they should <u>not</u> be included in annual reports.
- Report applications using Form 26

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#### **Reporting Multiple Applicators for One Business or Agency**

Registered businesses, agencies, or operations with multiple applicators may submit reports in 1 of 2 ways:

- Have each certified applicator/technician report their own applications 1. on Form 26 using only their own certification number, or
- The business can combine applications made by multiple applicators on 2. one Form 26 using only one applicator's certification ID number AND submit a Form 26A listing all certified applicators in their employ (regardless of if they made applications that year or not).
  - 26A should only list Certified Applicators and Certified Technicians, NOT • apprentices.





## **Communicate With Your Coworkers!**

Businesses may report on behalf of their applicators, but if reports are late or not accepted, <u>the applicator</u> will be issued a Notice of Violation, NOT the business.

- Applicators If someone is reporting on your behalf, please verify that they are doing so correctly and before the February 1<sup>st</sup> due date. If no one is reporting for you, then you must submit your own report.
- Businesses If you are reporting on behalf of your applicators, be sure to include <u>ALL</u> certified applicators employed during the reporting year (January 1<sup>st</sup> to December 31<sup>st</sup>) on Form 26A, even if they made no applications. Certified applicators left off a report, who receive a Notice of Violation, will need to be added to the company's existing report with the help of DEC staff.





- 2. Select "Report that you *did not* make applications"
- 3. Choose the selections that pertain to you.

  - It may be hiding in your spam folder!
